


A simple fish??? No way!!



Just like flowers, fish come in many shapes, sizes and colours.

They too are part of God's beautiful plan - Creation. But they do not live on the land - their world is surrounded by water.



Meet the "Three-Spined Stickleback" - so called because of the 3 sharp spines on its back.



Sticklebacks usually live in ponds and streams but some (like the 15-spine stickleback !!!) can be found in the sea.

The 3-spined variety is perhaps the most common type of stickleback in and around British waters. But there are many different species of stickleback to be found around the world including







Before the male goes in search of a mate (female partner) he has work to do.

He leaves the shoal to find a place that he likes, and where he will build his nest.

Once he has selected his site he patrols the territory keeping away other males ...
THIS PLACE IS HIS!


Once he has made it known that this is his ground he builds a nest in the sand, biting off tiny stems of weeds and gathering scraps of plants and binding them together with a sticky thread which he spins out from under his tail, rather like a spider does.

When it is finished it looks like a muff or a soft tunnel. He makes it neat by fanning away any loose bits with his tail.

ALL IS READY.

The next job for the male stickleback is to find a partner to mate with. Mating produces young.

Here's something to think about ...

With ALL FISH (not just sticklebacks) it is natural for the MALE and FEMALE to "mate" (make baby fish).

If they didn't mate and produce young all the living ones would die within a few years and there would be no more fish on Earth.

Anyway, back to our story finding a partner !!!

The male will go in search of a mature / adult female whose belly is swollen with eggs (the eggs are actually in her ovaries).

Haven't we talked about "ovaries" before in a previous book?

When he finds a suitable female partner he dances and darts around her in zig-zag patterns ... attracting her attention and leading her to his nest.

He hopes she will follow.



The baby fish grow inside the jelly-like eggs. After about 9 days they began to hatch.



They look just like their parents did when they were born.

Once they have hatched, the babies (sometimes called fry) are in constant danger - danger of being eaten alive by bigger creatures.

The father will protect them and fight off any enemy, but he needs help from the fry; if they scatter they are much harder to look after (remember ~ there could be as many as 100 to look after !!!). He tries to keep them close together so that they have a chance to SURVIVE. He is on duty 24 / 7... being a parent is a VERY big responsibility.

By the time they are about two weeks old they must look after themselves. The father's bright colours fade and he swims away. If you know anything about "food chains" you will have a good idea of what will happen to some young sticklebacks. Many will not survive to adulthood ... but some will, and in time (next year) will have grown to maturity and will produce families themselves.

Maths Challenge (get your calculator out!): if a pair of sticklebacks living in a stretch of river had 100 young and only 10 survived to have families of their own but each of the 10 produced 100 young (of which only 10 from each family survived) now many more sticklebacks would now be sharing the water with the original pair? Ans.
Now what if the same stretch of river had not one pair of sticklebacks but 100 pairs and the same story unfolded ? Ans
Now what if the survival rate wasn't 10/100 but 50/100 ?!!!!!!
What can we learn from this about helping people around the world who are desperately short of food?


(Gospel According to Matthew Ch. 2 Verses 12-16)

God warned the wise men in a dream not to go back to Herod because he meant the child harm. So they went home to their own country by a different way.



The stickleback story shows the importance of getting the "preparations" right before having a family ~ the eggs/fry will need safety & protection. The nest gives safety, and protection comes from a dutiful parent until the young fish are independent (about 2 weeks).
