Just a fluffy little bunny rabbit?

No way!

This is the artful dodger of the animal kingdom.

His side-step leaves any chaser mesmerised as he darts from left to right and from right to left at great speed.

Difficult to spot and even harder to catch.

And when danger gets too Close he will spring out of reach using his powerful hind legs, or he will disappear down the nearest hole.

He's a real jack-in-a-box!

The Rabbit - a success story.

Here is one of the most successful of land creatures. Successful? Oh yes! Rabbits can be found living in the wild in AND most parts of the world, and surviving very nicely thank you. But meeting one rabbit doesn't really tell the full story - you may as well meet the whole family brothers and sisters, parents and grandparents, aunts and uncles, nephews, nieces and cousins. And while you are at it you might as well meet the friends and neighbours - yes all of them - because rabbits don't choose to live alone. No, they prefer to live in groups, called colonies, and one of the main reasons for their successful existence is the fact that rabbit communities live underground where they are safe from most hungry predators. The 'streets' of their territory are an intricate network of tunnels called burrows which knit together to form a warren. This maze of passages provides each family with a home, a shelter, a place of comfort and safety in which to bring up their young. Like any successful community the rabbits fend for each other and jealously guard the warren against would be intruders. Let us look more closely at rabbits well and see how they make new life.

Turn and learn . . .

The Rabbit -

more than just a pet ... a creature of the wild whose history in this country dates back to Norman times where it was recognised as a friend to man - helping to trim grassland and hedgerows.

Perhaps the rabbit was man's first lawn mower!!

Like almost every other form of life, the species can be divided into male and female.


With sticklebacks we could tell male from female by both shape and colour. (Can you remember?) Swallows were almost impossible to tell apart - the sexes looked the same to the human eye.

With rabbits it is difficult to separate male from female at a distance, but close observation reveals two good clues

- 1. When side by side the female is usually larger than the male.
- The male rabbit has a broader head than the female, (see the box opposite).

A male rabbit is called a buck. A female rabbit is called a doe.

Our story begins in early Springtime, when an adult male rabbit (buck) seeks a female (doe) living within the warren.

Before they can mate and have a family the buck has to attract a doe.

No zig zag dancing like the stickleback.

No swooping and showing off like the swallow.


The buck's courtship is more gentle


a little tail flagging, a little nuzzling.

With luck the doe will return the affection shown by the buck. If she does it means she likes him and is ready to share with him the responsibility of having a family and looking after the young.

Remember...

If they didn't mate and produce young
all rabbits would die out within a matter of years.

When the baby rabbits are born they cannot see or hear. They are hairless and quite helpless. The litter may contain as many as 9 babies, each weighing about 40 - 50g.

They grow rapidly and by the time they are 18 days old weigh between 150 and 200g which is about _____ times their birth weight.

IMPORTANT FACT

A rabbit is a MAMMAL which means it has warm blood and feeds on its mother's milk when it is young.

The mother suckles the babies once a day for about 3 weeks.




After a few weeks the young rabbits are big enough to go outside and explore.
They begin to look for food. During this time the mother fiercely protects them from enemies.

When they are used to coming out of the burrow the mother stops feeding them with her own milk - it is time for the young rabbits to find their own food food like their parents eat.

Within months the young rabbits will be fully grown (adult), and ready to begin looking for a mate of their own to start a new family.

But at this stage, they spend their time eating and playing with other members of the family, and getting to know the rest of their community.





Fact: In 1859 Mr. Thomas Austen imported 24 wild British rabbits into Australia for "sport".

By 1865 (only 6 years later) 20,000 had been killed on Austen's estate alone.



Fact: In the UK., in 1939, Parliament passed the "Prevention of Damage by Rabbits Act" giving local authorities the power to force landowners to destroy wild rabbits because they were "a pest".

Thought: What would happen to a farmer's crops (food grown to feed us) if there was no forr of control to keep the rabbit numbers down?

Thought: Rabbits breed all the year round and their young can breed when they are SIX MONTHS OLD. Given "favourable circumstances" it is reckoned that a single pair of rabbits would in 3 years have a progeny numbering 13, 718, 000 that's thirteen million,!!!!!!

(Remember the scientific formula female eggs + male sperm = new life)

Modern scientists have learned how to **control the birth patterns** of a great many species of lif ... from rare, endangered animals to more familiar ones like sheep, horses, cattle and pigs. By collecting sperm from a male animal and placing it into the womb of a female (close to her egg they can help the female to become pregnant and produce young. There are many reasons whethis might be done here are just two:

to save species which are in danger of becoming extinct

to produce more animals which give us meat, milk etc.






Bend Me, Shape Me



But as for the type of person you have become ... this is down to two "influences" ...


1. the people who have moved in and out of your life over the last 8 or 9




These children have a problem


What advice would you give them?
